The program of The General of Fundamental of Engineering program will be developed in 81 hours. The 81 hours is divided into 27 sessions of 3 hours per session

Methodology

In each session the participants will review two chapters in order to have sufficient time to discuss and clarify concepts, doubts, etc.

Each session is divided in 4 activities

Activity # 1 is a short quiz in order to evaluate the knowledge of all participants associated to the chapters of the current class and past classes (cumulative). The time of quizzes can be modified.

In activity # 2, an assigned speaker will do the presentation of the first chapter of the current class.

The speaker will explain all participants the fundamental concepts and demonstrate how to solve the problems or exercises. The speaker must develop as minimum two problems (or exercises).

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The objective is to provide the best, fastest and efficient way to solve problems or exercises applying the analytical and transferable knowledge skills. The speaker is responsible to provide all participants a summary guideline. This summary guideline will be very useful to follow the explanation during the presentation

Break of 10 minutes

In activity # 3 the second assigned speaker will do the presentation of the second chapter of the current class.

The speaker will explain all participants the fundamental concepts and demonstrate how to solve the problems or exercises. The speaker must develop as minimum two problems (or exercises).

The objective is to provide the best and fastest way to solve problems or exercises applying the analytical and transferable knowledge skills. The speaker is responsible to provide all participants a summary guideline. This summary guideline will be very useful to follow the explanation during the presentation

Break of 10 minutes

Activity # 4 is to conclude the class, reviewing and clarifying concepts or doubts as well make comments or any type of suggestions for the benefits of the group.
